Innovation Eye Centre is using a social enterprise business model with an entrepreneurial approach to solve a social problem- avoidable blindness and visual impairment. We aim of create positive social impact through the restoration of sight and prevention of avoidable blindness. As we combine business discipline, medical skills and compassion we will ensure that ALL can receive high quality affordable eye care services irrespective of their social economic status to the community in South Western Region of Kenya and beyond.

The cross-subsidization model ensures that services are available at normal rates to the people who can afford and substantially below cost to the most vulnerable and low income members of our society. This is done through our Private Clinic, General Clinic and Community Outreach Eye Camps. We are engaged in community outreach programs to ensure we can avail eye care services to the underserved communities in the society.

Medical Director's Report and Highlights 2021

e started the year 2021 with a mindset to pull out of the Covid-19 pandemic crisis stronger, being guided by the wise words of Winston Churchill - "Never let a good crisis go to waste". The year therefore was filled with programs on how to continue and even exceed our mission of providing affordable quality eye care to all despite the prevailing global economic and health conditions. The programs focused on quality eye care, novel methods of reaching out to the needy, partnerships, and Human Resource development. The following are the highlights of what transpired in the year 2021.

- We continued maintaining high level Service and Clinical quality standards as were measured by the parameters in place. Our Cataract surgery quality outcome average for the year was 83%, which exceeds the recommended WHO standard of 80%.
- We successfully implemented the Community Referral System Program which aimed to replace the regular outreach program to ensure we could still reach out to the poor and vulnerable in the community. Towards the end of the year as the Covid 19 guidelines were eased we started to cautiously perform some outreach programs.

- Our usual national and international partners continued working with us and we also formed New Partnerships with Himalayan Cataract Program [HCP], Christian Blind Mission [CBM], Fred Hollows Foundation [FHF], Operation Eyesight Universal [OEU], OUI Inc [Japan], and Rwanda International Institute of Ophthalmology [RIIO].
- Perhaps the most notable initiative for the year 2021 was the commencement of the Residence Training Program under COECSA in partnership with RIIO. Our long-term partner, the Fiat Lux Foundation provided a full scholarship for one of the students. This program will go a long way in providing well trained ophthalmologists who are usually very scarce for our hospital and the region.
- During the year we hired and trained five Registered Nurses to provide eye care in our hospital.

These initiatives are all contained in our Strategic Plan 2020 to 2025 that is our guiding document and we constantly review and update. The overall aim is to serve more patients in the region and be sustainable to ensure that avoidable blindness has been eradicated. Other aspects of the Strategic Plan can be viewed in our website.

Projects and Programmes

ACCESS (African Centres of Excellence in Cataract Surgical Services) PROJECT Phase 3

isii Eye Hospital continued with the ACCESS Project that started in July 2020. The ACCESS Project is a network of 5 eye hospitals in Sub Saharan Africa funded by the Hilton Foundation with the objective of improving service delivery in eye health in eye hospitals with High volume, High Quality Affordable and Accessible eye care services. Aravind Eye Care System/LAICO supports capacity building to strengthen systems and processes of the ACCESS Eye Hospitals.

Through LEAP Collaborative Learning Sessions capacity has been built on how to develop and strengthen Community Referral Systems and Vision Center Development as primary eye care centres as well as emphasizing the importance of achieving universal eye health coverage.

FRED HOLLOWS FOUNDATION PROJECT

The partnership with Fred Hollows Foundation is support towards eliminating preventable blindness and visual impairment especially the marginalized, underserved and poor patients in the community.

The Fred Hollows Foundation supported eye surgeries for patients in the lower socio economic group. Cataract Surgeries were free of cost for the poor patients. The project ran between the months of August 2021 to December 2021.



COMMUNITY REFERRAL SYSTEM PROGRAM

The Community Referral System (CRS) is a door-to-door eye screening program with the aim of identifying cataracts and other eye conditions at the community level. This was necessitated by the Covid – 19 pandemic which affected our outreach programs as the regular

eye camps were stopped for some time. The process is being conducted by trained cataract finders who undertake door to door visits in identified target geographical areas to screen the population. The screening is done using a smartphone app known as *Peek Acuity* which takes visual acuity.




