The Diabetic Retinopathy screening program is a one-year (November 2022 to December 2023) pilot project for a sustainable blindness prevention that is being carried out with the partnership of Right to Sight-Norway and the Ministry of Health Kisii County.

KEROKA VISION CENTRE - A COMMUNITY BASED VISION CENTRE

Keroka Vision Centre is a community based vision Centre in partnerships with Operation Eyesight Universal. In January 2656 people were screened in the community by Community Health Volunteers and 67 referrals made to Keroka Vision Centre. 128 patients (Walk in and CHVs Referrals) were treated at Keroka Vision Centre. Patients who need further treatment are referred to the Main Hospital- Kisii Eye Hospital.
