CASE STUDY-MR. OMBATA

For the past three years, Mr. Ombata (33 years) has been experiencing gradual blurred vision after he was involved in a terrible accident that left his right limb fractured completely. Previously before the accident Mr. Ombata was a hawker at Nyangusu where he would vend for his daily food.

Due to financial constraints it was hard for Mr. Ombata to seek any medical attention for his vision problems. His vision kept on deteriorating.

The breakthrough came when his sister learned of the Kisii Eye Hospital eye screening camp at Ritumbe Health Centre. At the camp, Mr. Ombata was diagnosed with bilateral cataracts, a condition that was robbing him of his sight. The medical team wasted no time and arranged for him to receive cataract surgery at the Base Hospital of Kisii Eye Hospital.

Thanks to the timely intervention and expertise of the medical professionals, Mr. Ombata successfully underwent cataract surgery, restoring his vision and providing him with newfound hope for the future. This case highlights the importance of accessible eye care services and the transformative impact individuals can have on the lives just like Mr. Ombata who would have otherwise remained burdened by untreated cataracts.
