Chief Medical Director's Report

The year 2024 just like the past ones was packed with significant projects and activities that are maintaining Innovation Eye Centre as the leading institution that offers quality and sustainable impact to eye care in the rural and urban communities of South Western Kenya. We have maintained our direct touch to the community through door to door screening, outreach camps and most importantly working with Community Health Personnel [CHP] to ensure no one is left behind. This is best demonstrated by a project we held in partnership with Operation Eyesight Universal that declared 10 villages from Kisii and Nyamira counties free of avoidable blindness. Details of this program are included in this report.



Perhaps one of the most significant milestones this year was the expansion to Kisumu. In collaboration with our partners, The Summit Healthcare Hospitals Ltd we established a state-of-art eye hospital in Kisumu that is more appealing to up marked clientele and more accessible to the population in Kisumu and the western part of the country. It also more accessible across the borders to the other lake region countries like Uganda and Rwanda. Our Nairobi clientele find the Kisumu eye hospital easily accessible due to the presence an airport in Kisumu city. Besides the modern phacoemulsification cataract surgery, laser treatment, glaucoma and corneal surgery we have now introduced Vitro retinal surgery services in Kisumu, to ensure all the major eye care services are available in Kisumu.

Although the country has been undergoing some significant tumultuous politico-economic situation, we have not only maintained but actually increased the number of patients we take care of. This has been achieved first and foremost by our social entrepreneurship model that ensures we serve everyone in spite of their socio-economic situation, but also by the support of our partners. The Fred Hollows Foundation has maintained its support to the vulnerable in the society and recently we established a partnership with Cure Blindness Project to ensure that no one suffers curable blindness from cataract just simply because they cannot afford care.

On behalf of the management team I wish to extend utmost gratitude to our partners, the board of directors and our staff for the tremendous dedication and commitment to ensure we achieve our purpose of To Deliver First Class Comprehensive Eye Care Services to All in order to Improve Lives.





Operation Eyesight Universal

Kisii Villages Declared Free Of Avoidable Blindness

On 20th November 2024, the Ministry of Health Kenya, Directorate of Health Care Services–Ophthalmic Services, Operation Eye Sight Universal team, in partnership with Innovation Eye Centre, declared villages in Keroka, Kisii County, free of avoidable blindness. This milestone followed the screening of 10,435 patients over the year, reflecting the success of community-based eye care initiatives. The success of the program was greatly bolstered by the efforts of the Kisii and Nyamira Community Health Volunteers, supported by the Public Health Office, by conducting comprehensive door-to-door screenings. The event was graced by Dr. Michael Gichangi from the Ministry of Health Kenya, Directorate of Health Care Services–Ophthalmic Services, who commended the program’s transformative impact and emphasized the importance of partnerships in combating preventable blindness.







World Glaucoma Week Training And Awareness







Keroka Vision Centre

Keroka Vision Centre which was established in collaboration with Operation Eyesight Universal is a community based vision centre whose objective is to provide access to eye care services among communities living in Kisii County. Through door to door screening, community Health Promoters target communities that are empowered to take responsibility of their eye health through education and promotion activities and referrals made to the vision centre for treatment. Community outreach eye camps were also conducted to ensure that target villages are declared free of avoidable blindness.

Ogembo Vision Centre

Community Screening for Presbyopia and Dispensing of Near Vision Eye Glasses

Ogembo Vision Centre was established with support from Novartis XOVA Award. Innovation Eye Centre, in collaboration with PEEK Vision LIF Peek Vision Foundation and Operation Eyesight Universal, completed a vital project at Ogembo Vision Centre aimed at addressing the growing issue of presbyopia in Kisii, Kenya. The project, which ran from 12th June to 12th August 2024, was designed to enhance community eye health through targeted screenings, health education, and the provision of near vision eyeglasses.



The project's key objectives were to train screeners on refraction for near vision and health education, conduct community screenings and refraction for near vision, and issue near vision glasses at the household at a cost as well as to conduct treatment outreach for the hard to reach patients. Those identified with other eye problems were referred to Ogembo Vision Centre for review and appropriate management. Those reviewed at the vision centre and needed further checkup and management were referred to Kisii Eye Hospital.
