PROPOSED COLLABORATIVE RESEARCH PROJECT TO ADVANCE EYE HEALTH IN THE COMMUNITY

Innovation Eye Centre hosted a stakeholders meeting with Operation Eyesight Universal, KEMRI, PEEK Vision and the London School of Hygiene and Tropical Medicine to address the issue of Near Vision Impairment caused by unaddressed presbyopia which can be corrected by Near Vision Glasses. A proposed research project will find out if uptake of Near Vision Eyeglasses can lead to improved quality of life both at the household level and at the workplace.
